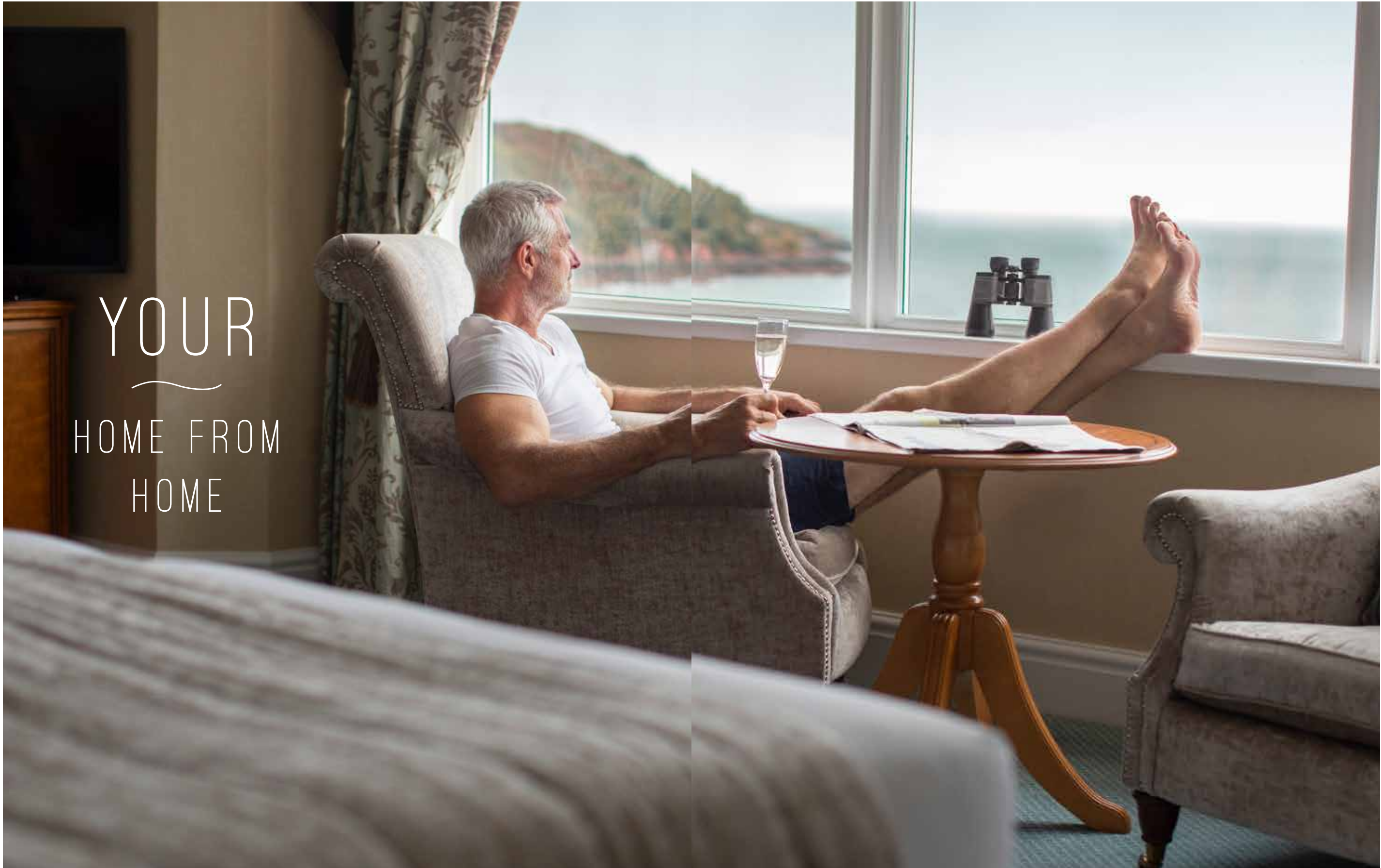

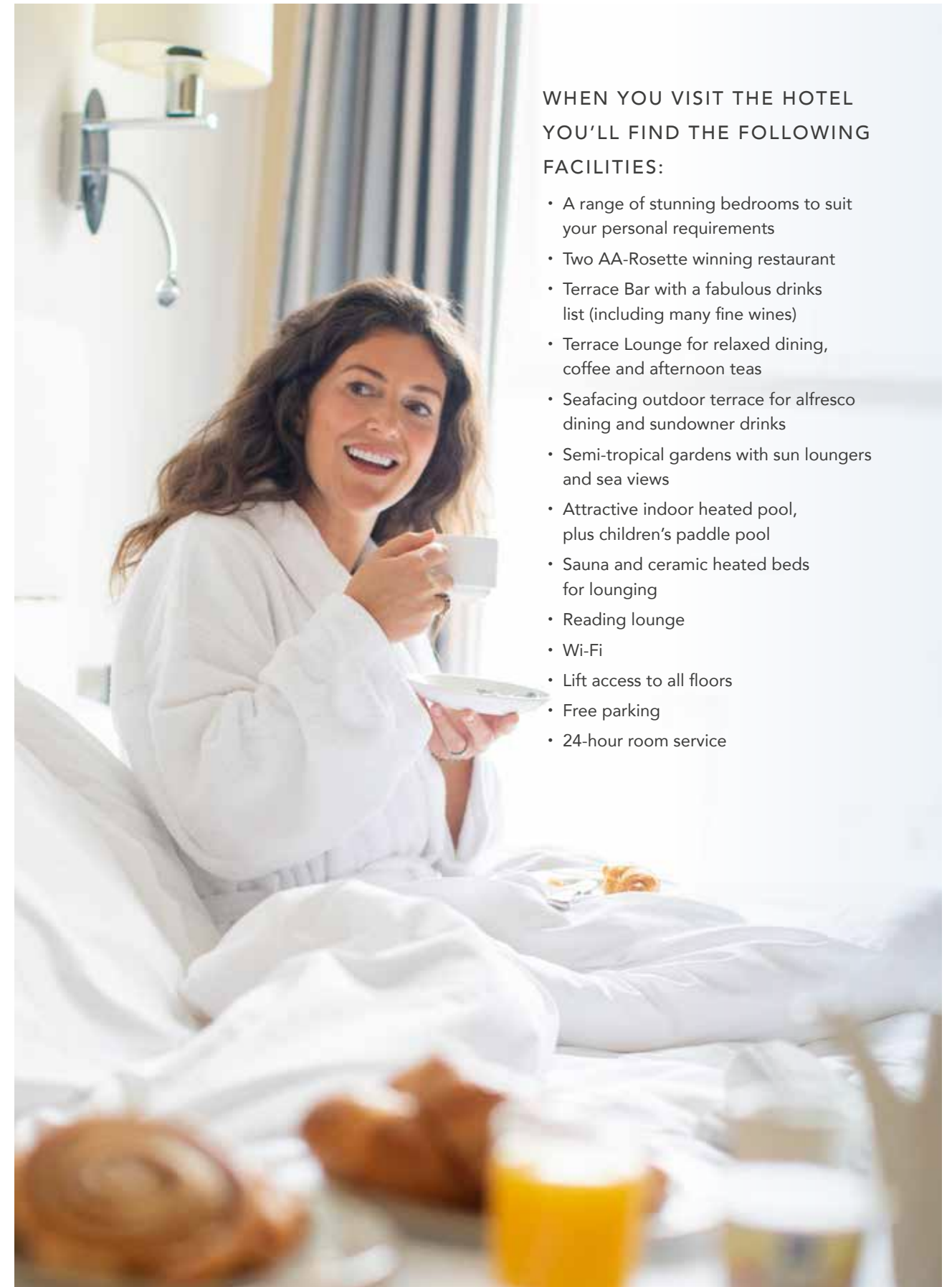

Or leave the car at the hotel and hop on the passenger ferry to St Mawes for a charming 2.8-mile trip across the harbour which culminates in smart seaside charm.

From long stretches of sand to jaw-dropping scenery, this coastal county makes a fabulous retreat for anyone looking to escape the city scene. You'll quickly realise that you don't have to fly around the world to seek adventures as there's plenty to discover much closer to home. # AUTUMN AMBLES

DON'T FALL BEHIND. DISCOVER CLEAR BLUE SEAS, CLIFFTOP VIEWS AND SECLUDED HIDDEN BEACHES THIS SEASON.

If you're a lover of the great outdoors, an autumn break could be right up your street. Lace-up those walking boots and put your best foot forward as you trek along the South West Coast Path. The path meanders its way around the Cornish coast for dozens of miles – and you can pick it up close to our hotel.



## PENDENNIS CASTLE WALK

*Easy - 2.9 miles (4.6km)*

A visit to Pendennis Point, where there have been fortifications defending Falmouth's waterways for over two millennia. Also taking in the sandy beach at Gyllyngvase and the exotic plants along the seafront, the walk is mostly flat and on easy paths and pavements.



## SWANPOOL & FALMOUTH DOCKS WALK

*Moderate - 5.4 miles (8.6km)*

A tour of some of the historical features of the British Empire's second most important port, with its coastal artillery defences, the docks built after more than 16 thousand vessels visited in a nine-year period, and the Custom House Quay where the famous packet ships carried the post. A mostly level walk on pavements and good paths, with one relatively steep hill.



## ROSEMULLION WALK

*Challenging - 4.5 miles (7.2km)*

Starting as a headland walk with wide-ranging coastal views and banks of vivid wildflowers, this route sweeps into the inland waterways of the Helford River, where the Secret Intelligence Service based a flotilla for night-time missions across the Channel to France. None of the ascent or descent is steep, and the paths, though narrow, are along mostly easy terrain.

Brewing the likes of Rattler and Healey's Cornish juices, Healey's Cyder Farm is the biggest cyder-maker in Cornwall. At Healey's HQ, fruity preserves simmer in the jam kitchen, England's oldest whisky ages in the cellars, and a range of well-known cyders are produced in the press house. You can take guided tours of the farm, cellars and huge orchard, before taste-testing the full range of products.

# Blooming great gardens

With longer, brighter days and the warmth gradually returning during spring in Cornwall, it's a good time to get out and start exploring. Enjoy delicate snowdrops, spring daffodils and vibrant blossoms as our gardens burst into colour.

## WE'VE PICKED SOME OF THE BEST SPRING GARDENS TO VISIT THIS SEASON

### TREBAH GARDEN

Trebah Garden is a beautiful sub-tropical paradise with a stunning coastal backdrop. The 24 acre gardens boast four miles of footpaths that take you through giant gunnera and bamboo forests, as well as secret lakes before ending at the garden's very own private beach. Hydrangeas line the pathways full of colourful lilacs, pinks and whites – perfect for spring.

### THE LOST GARDENS OF HELIGAN

Discover romantic Victorian gardens and pleasure grounds along winding paths laid out over two centuries ago. Heligan is described as an exotic outdoor jungle, with over 200 acres waiting to be explored. Don't miss the famous Mud Maid, Giant's Head and Grey Lady.



### LAMORRAN

Take the ferry from Falmouth to St Mawes, walk half a mile to Lamorran House overlooking the bay, and you will be transported to a romantic subtropical garden. Lamorran Gardens is on a 4 acre south facing hillside with the sea and St Anthony Head as the backdrop. This intimate garden takes visitors through archways and curving gravel paths to discover different areas such as the woodland area and Japanese style water garden.

### EDEN PROJECT

Based on the outskirts of St Austell, 'the world's largest greenhouse' boasts both Mediterranean and tropical gardens in stylish biomes. The team at the Eden Project are committed to conservation and promote this through their rare species of plants and wildlife.
